Fr. Michael McGivney Beatification: (Part 1 of 3)

Took place October 2020 at St. Mary Church, New Haven, Connecticut, where he served as a priest and founded the Knights of Columbus, one of the most powerful organizations in the Catholic Church. Pope Francis recognized "*He did everything possible to provide for the needs of those in need*." He was a true witness of the Gospel of Charity. He joins two other American beatified recently, Solanus Casey and Stanley Rother.

The murders of three victims in the Basilica of Notre Dame, October 29, 2020, two women ages 44 and 60, one man 55 years, custodian of the Basilica. Authorities have arrested five other men who officials say were involved in the planning of the attack.



St. Isabella's Church Protocol for Indoor Mass

- 1. Every person must always wear a mask.
- 2. To enter the church, all parishioners enter through the front of the church (no side entries).
- 3. Sanitation stations are at the entryway of the church. All parishioners need to sanitize their hands prior to entering the church.
- 4. Parishioners have a choice to go left or right down the side aisles. No one can walk down the center aisle.
- 5. When entering a pew, please slide all the way down to the end. The next person entering, will sit six feet away (there will be tape on each pew to show six feet separation).
- 6. At the end of Mass, communion will take place. Everyone in each pew must stand up and get in line six feet apart from each other. Please pick up all your belongings, whether you are receiving communion or not. If you are not receiving communion, please exit from the side doors. No one can return to their seat.
- 7. Please do not congregate at the exit areas.
