Who governs the Church? (Part 2 of 2)

The Netherlands Government has expanded its euthanasia policy for ages 1 to 12 years who are terminally ill. Parents consent is required and two doctors. Minors 16 to 17 years do not need parental consent. In 2019, 6,361 cases of euthanasia were reported in the country.

St. Isabella's Church Protocol for Indoor Mass

- 1. Every person must always wear a mask.
- 2. To enter the church, all parishioners enter through the front of the church (no side entries).
- 3. Sanitation stations are at the entryway of the church. All parishioners need to sanitize their hands prior to entering the church.
- Parishioners have a choice to go left or right down the side aisles. No 4. one can walk down the center aisle.
- When entering a pew, please slide all the way down to the end. The 5. next person entering, will sit six feet away (there will be tape on each pew to show six feet separation).
- 6. At the end of Mass, communion will take place. Everyone in each pew must stand up and get in line six feet apart from each other. Please pick up all your belongings, whether you are receiving communion or not. If you are not receiving communion, please exit from the side doors. No one can return to their seat.
- 7. Please do not congregate at the exit areas.
