

Myanmar: Sister Ann Tawng kneels regularly before the military praying the rosary with protesters, facing the army. She said, "I have to do this. A voice to

stop the killing." 831 protesters have been killed since February by the military. 85,000 people driven out of their homes. Displaced families have fled to Catholic churches, Buddhist temples for safety but the military invade these sanctuaries. The military acts with complete impunity. She does not know when she will be silenced.


