Archbishop Cordileone invites all parishes in San Francisco, Marin, San Mateo to participate in a public call for reopening churches at a level consistent with other activities in San Francisco and with stringent health and safety protocols in place. Schedule of processions/ demonstrations & Mass:

- 8:30 a.m., St. Anthony of Padua, 3215 Cesar Chavez,
- 9 a.m., St. Dominic, 2390 Bush St, SF
- 9:15 a.m., St. Patrick, 756 Mission St, SF
- 10 a.m., all processions join at United Nations Plaza. Archbishop Cordileone will greet the people coming in the three processions as well as those who arrive independently at UN Plaza. Archbishop will then carry the monstrance in procession. The entire group proceeds to the Cathedral, leaves UN Plaza at 10:15 a.m.
- 10:45 a.m. Arrival of procession at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption, SF
- 11 a.m., outdoor Masses at the Cathedral
