### Catholic Religious Sisters

The number of religious sisters in the U.S. continues to drop. In 1965 there were 180,000 sisters in the U.S. Today, there are only 42,441 sisters, that is a 76% drop. There are reasons for this:

- 1. Individualism, which is to satisfy the self
- 2. Millennials don't like rules, that makes community life difficult
- 3. Today's woman wants to be married
- 4. Commitment does not come easy to young people, many run from it.

Sisters of Mercy are the largest community of sisters in the U.S. Sisters are not going to disappear. But they will become much smaller in Catholic life.

#### Parish Comment


