Vatican

The Vatican has changed Canon Law for approving liturgical translations. Rather than a bishop deciding adaptations, it must now go to Bishop Conferences for liturgical adaptations. More bishops will be involved in confirming changes to the liturgy.

Late last November, we updated the Parish on amounts still due for the 2020 and 2021 Archdi-
