The 13th Century Church (Part 4)

Two great Orders were founded at this time: the Franciscans and the Dominicans.

The Franciscans witnessed to the Gospel by living lives of absolute poverty. They owned no property, had no place to call home, begged for food and anything else. St. Francis was not an ordinary priest. He remains one of the most esteemed individuals in church history. St. Francis died in 1226.

St. Dominic was an ordained priest, and the Order of Preachers was their charism. Legend has it that the Rosary was revealed to Dominic by Our Lady, to pray for heretics. The Dominicans also begged for food.

These two religious communities became known as the Mendicant Orders, a Latin word meaning "to beg."

PRECAUTIONS DURING COLD & FLU SEASON AND THE COVID-19 VIRUS

During this time of the Covid-19 virus and its rapidly changing situation, St. Isabella's asks parishioners to strictly observe the following precautions:

- 1) When ill, remain at home, and watch TV Mass on Sunday mornings, (see box in next column).
- 2) ALL Ministers should excuse themselves if they feel any hint of a cold or flu.
- 3) Suspension of the Cup at Communion and the Holy Water at the doors until further notice.
- Wash your hands often and for at least 20 seconds with soap and water.
- 5) Keep a "social distance" of 6 feet between persons.

NOTE: All church events have been canceled **EXCEPT** our regular Monday through Sunday Mass Schedule and Saturday Confessions. This is a changing situation—When possible, updates of our current situation will be posted on our website.
