

- + January 1: Mary, the Holy Mother of God (Friday)
- + December 8: Immaculate Conception (Wednesday)
- + December 25: Christmas (Saturday)

- * The **Ascension** is observed on Sunday, May 16, 2021.
- * The **Assumption**, August 15, is on a Sunday.
- * All Saints, November 1, Monday. All faithful are encourage to attend Mass (not a Holy Day of Obligation)
- * Christmas falls on a Saturday. Sunday, December 26 is the Feast of the Holy Family.

Special Days of Prayer

- January 1: Day of Prayer for World Peace
- January 22: Day of Prayer and Penance for Life
- February 17: Day of Prayer for the General Needs of Humankind
- September 6: Day of Prayer for Human Rights and Labor (Labor Day)
- November 25: Day of Prayer for the Fruits of the Earth (Thanksgiving Day)

The faithful of the Archdiocese are asked to observe these Special Days of Prayer in their devotions or other private prayer, in the General Intercessions of the Mass, and through the selection of other liturgically proper prayers for the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours.
