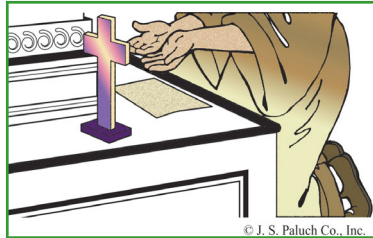

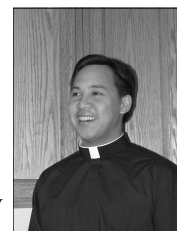

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am pleased to announce the conclusion of our 2014 Annual Appeal. We collected a total of \$100,391.10 dollars, exceeding our goal of \$99,700.00. All excess funds will be returned to the parish to help fund our projects for 2015. I would like to sincerely thank everyone who contributed. Without your generosity, we



would have never reached our goal.

2015 is a year of stability for St. Isabella's Parish. After taking in feedback and listening to our parishioners with regards to the Capital Campaign, we have decided to focus on key items of maintenance and improvements. These items will include building a new roof for the Parish Center and St. Isabella's School for 2015, and building a new roof for the church in 2016. Other improvements will include building a ramp for handicapped access to the church, and improving the audio/visual systems for the church.

More information on our parish projects will be presented at a later date. To prepare for and to help fund these projects, starting in the month of February, we will have a second maintenance collection on the third Sunday of the month.

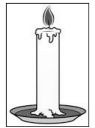
Mill Street Homeless Shelter

"May God at the intercession of St. Blaise preserve you from throat troubles and every other evil."

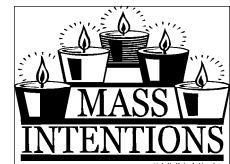
St. Isabella's Mens Club Pancake Breakfast
