- 4. Of King David Tribe of Judah
- 5. A Carpenter (craftsman)
- 6. Married Mary. He probably was 20 and Mary 15 years of age.
- 7. In Italy, Cathedral San Lorenzo Perugia, the wedding ring Joseph gave Mary is preserved there.


