Luke 12:13-21



A Church is made up of three parts:

- A. Faith, Beliefs, Doctrine, Morals
- B. Liturgy, Sacraments, Prayer
- C. Community, Socials, Pastoral Works.

All three are required to be churched. To leave one out = 33% which makes us less churched.
