The 40-day period is called **Lent** after an old English word meaning 'lengthen'. St. Isabella Indoor Mass Safety Protocol

- 1. Every person must always wear a mask.
- 2. To enter the church, all parishioners enter through the front of the church (no side entries).
- 3. Sanitation stations are at the entryway of the church. All parishioners need to sanitize their hands prior to entering the church.
- 4. Parishioners have a choice to go left or right down the side aisles. No one can walk down the center aisle.
- 5. When entering a pew, please slide all the way down to the end. The next person entering, will sit six feet away (there will be tape on each pew to show six feet separation).
- 6. At the end of mass, communion will take place. Everyone in each pew must stand up and get in line six feet apart from each other. Please pick up all your belongings, whether you are receiving communion or not. If you are not receiving communion, please exit from the side doors. No one can return to their seat.
- 7. Please do not congregate at the exit areas.

The Bridge - News from the Archdiocese

Churches reopen to 25% capacity (re: U.S. Supreme Court issued an injunction on February 5th.) Parishioners that those who are sick should not attend Mass, even if it's "just a cold" and they feel well enough to attend, and that the dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation remains in place for now. The elderly and others at high risk from COVID, as well as those who care for them, may choose in good conscience to remain at home.
