<u>Hell (Part 2 of 4)</u>: Many believe there is no hell contrary to a loving God, there are consequences to all actions including spiritual actions. Hell is self exclusion from communion with God, mortal sins of living life is necessary for this. The words of Christ are clear. Check Matthew 13:41-42. The choice to do evil, not to love leads to hell. Christ did not speak only once on hell but many times. The Gospels also include hell in his teachings. The saying "go to hell" means get away from me, you are a rotten being.

Lenten—Fasting and Abstinence

These practices are to help us have mastery over instincts and bodily temptations. During Lent, Catholics are asked to refrain from meat on Fridays, exemptions age, health, travelling. Catholics aged 18 to 59 fasting is obligated on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means only one full meal that day. It can be broken into ½ lunch, ½ dinner. Interestingly fasting is related to the intake of food, not drinks or alcohol. Fasting is not obligated on solemnities.


