First Christians were all Jews, they practiced Jewish mosaic laws, including circumcision. As Gentiles seeked to enter the Church, do they have to practice Judaism? Another words, become a Jew in order to become a Christian. The decision was a definitive No. Not all Jewish customs, ritual cleanings, circumcision, foods apply to be Christian, only the will to follow Christ. Out of 614 Jewish laws, only four will be applied to Gentiles: (Acts 15-20)

- 1. Avoid idols
- 2. Unlawful marriages
- 3. Meat of strangled animals
- 4. Drinking blood


