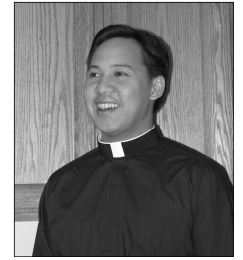

Letter Campaign Against SB360, “Seal of Confession” Bill

Archbishop Cordileone asks all the faithful of the Archdiocese to contact their state Assembly representative to voice their opposition to SB360, proposed legislation that threatens the confidentiality of the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. The bill would take away the full right to confession from priests and everyone who works with priests in parishes and Church agencies statewide.
