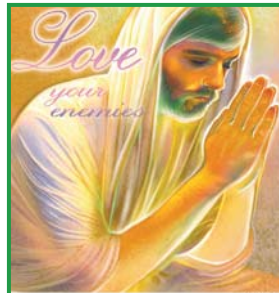

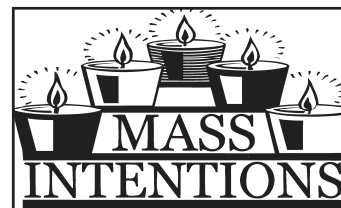

Eucharistic Practices: The dipping of the host in to the consecrated wine is called "intinction." The current edition of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal states: "The blood of the Lord may be received either by drinking from the chalice directly or by intinction" (245), so the practice is permitted. What is not permitted is for the lay faithful to self-communicate by dipping the host that they will consume into the precious blood. This can be done only by a minister of the Eucharist
