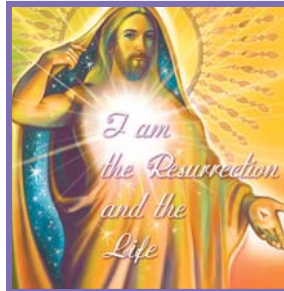

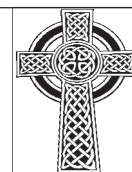

The 13th Century Church (Part 5)






A “Heretic” is one whose teachings are false. Two heresies sprung up in France in the 13th Century:

The Waldensians, who criticized the Church for its wealth and power, were founded by merchant Peter Waldo. Waldo and his followers advocated that all Christians should live a life of poverty. They denied the doctrine of purgatory and the authority of the Catholic Church. They broke from the church denouncing the Pope, Bishops, and Priests. Waldo was excommunicated by Pope Lucius III.

The Albigensians, named after the town of Albi, France. They denied incarnation, the divinity of Christ, and the real presence of Christ at the Mass and Resurrection. They also said the Church was enslaved by the evil god and had perverted Jesus’ teachings. In 1209, Pope Innocent III called for a crusade against the Albigensians, and they were defeated with the fall of their stronghold in Montsegur, France in 1244.

PRECAUTIONS DURING COLD & FLU SEASON AND THE COVID-19 VIRUS

During this time of the Covid-19 virus and its rapidly changing situation, St. Isabella's asks parishioners to strictly observe the following precautions:

- 1) When ill, remain at home, and watch TV Mass on Sunday mornings, (see box in next column).
- 2) **ALL** Ministers should excuse themselves if they feel any hint of a cold or flu.
- 3) Suspension of the Cup at Communion and the Holy Water at the doors until further notice.
- 4) Wash your hands often and for at least 20 seconds with soap and water.
- 5) "Social distancing" of at least 6 feet between persons.

NOTE: All church events, the public Mass schedule, and confessions have been canceled, by directive of Archbishop Cordileone. This is a changing situation—When possible, updates of our current situation will be posted on our website.

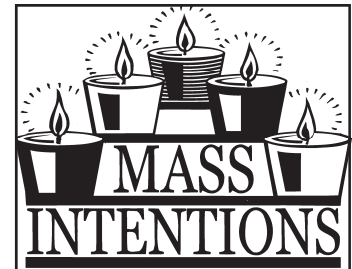
