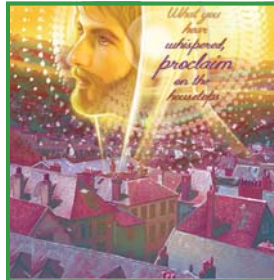

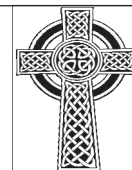

St. Isabella's Mass Services



Beginning July 5th, St. Isabella's will have two outdoor Masses, at 9:00 am and 11:30 am, on the school field. Parishioners are asked to bring their own masks and sanitizers, and to observe social distancing rules. Those in attendance will also be asked to sign a consent form.

Local Church Voice: As wil all epidemics the world has known, it is the poor who suffer the most. Black Americans make up 13% of the U.S. population and have 33% of the reported deaths from Covid-19. Many work for low wages and are working on the front lines of the pandemic. Limited opportunities for housing, high rates of infection, and poor access to health care are all contributing factors. Another negative factor is systemic racism. It is worthy to note that San Francisco diocese has never had a black Bishop. Does this mean the Church is racist?

Did you know...? Our local St. Vincent de Paul has a Food Pantry and we can contribute.

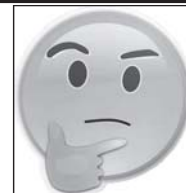

PRECAUTIONS DURING COLD & FLU SEASON AND THE COVID-19 VIRUS

During this time of the Covid-19 virus and its rapidly changing situation, St. Isabella's asks parishioners to strictly observe the following precautions:

- 1) When ill, remain at home, and watch TV Mass on Sunday mornings, (see box in next column).
- 2) **ALL** Ministers should excuse themselves if they feel any hint of a cold or flu.
- 3) Suspension of the Cup at Communion and the Holy Water at the doors until further notice.
- 4) Wash your hands often and for at least 20 seconds with soap and water.
- 5) "Social distancing" of at least 6 feet between persons.

NOTE: All church events, the public Mass schedule, and confessions have been canceled, by directive of Archbishop Cordileone. This is a changing situation—When possible, updates of our current situation will be posted on our website.

SAINT JOHN FISHER (1469-1535) AND SAINT THOMAS MORE (1477-1535)

June 22

From Robert Bolt's classic *A Man for All Seasons* to *Show-time's* edgy *The Tudors*, Thomas More endears himself still: lawyer-statesman of impeccable integrity, remarried widower and affectionate father delighting in a lively household—four children, a pet monkey, even a paid jester! And challenges still: humanist-reformer, yet champion of Catholic faith and papal primacy. John Paul II named him Patron of Statesmen and Politicians, citing More's generous work, both as a lawyer and in government service, on behalf of the poorest and most marginalized people of his time, as well as his promotion of education for all sectors of society. More's decision for principle over politics, conscience over convenience prompted his final words: "I die the king's good servant, but God's first." Alone among England's bishops,

John Fisher dared challenge Henry VIII's divorce and repudiation of the papacy. When the Pope named the imprisoned Fisher a cardinal, Henry thundered: "Don't bother sending Fisher's red hat here; I'll send Fisher's head to Rome!" Whose "good servants" are we first? Isn't a right conscience worth the pain of standing alone?

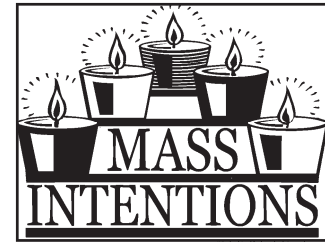
