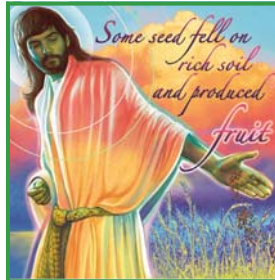

Did you know...? Our local St. Vincent de Paul has a Food Pantry and we can contribute.



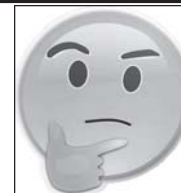

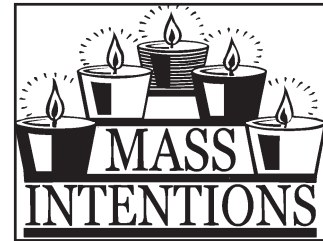
Fr. Ken passed away on June 24, 2020 in the Rectory of St. Vincent de Paul Church, where he served as pastor after St. Isabella's.
