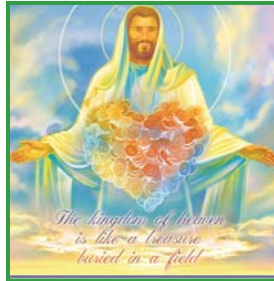

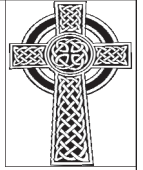


From the Pew: St. Isabella’s will drop the 11:30 am Mass. Few people are attending the Mass, and the heat of the midday is a factor.

PRECAUTIONS DURING COLD & FLU SEASON AND THE COVID-19 VIRUS

During this time of the Covid-19 virus and its rapidly changing situation, St. Isabella's asks parishioners to strictly observe the following precautions:
