Archdiocesan Annual Appeal Update

Late last November, we updated the Parish on amounts still due for the 2020 and 2021 Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. For the two years, St Isabella still had an outstanding balance of \$79,538 due. Our Parish community responded very generously and we have received donations totaling \$77,913, which is just \$1,625 short of full payment.

Your Parish Finance Committee met on January 28th and authorized final payment of the AAA for 2020 and 2021 out of Parish reserves. We are now fully paid up on AAA...Thank You! Looking forward, we are currently in discussions with the Archdiocese on the 2022 AAA and will be updating the Parish in the coming weeks.
