Luke 18 : 9 - 14



This Pharisee has an incredible negative view of humanity except for himself. Everyone is a sinner and he knows their sins while he himself has canonized himself to sainthood. What he fails to realize is, his own sins of pride and egotistical narcissism is more sinful than the list of sins he mentions - the former are sins of the flesh, his are sins of the soul.
