Luke 21 : 5 - 19



When Luke was writing his Gospel, the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem has already taken place. Christ's words have come true. When Christ was crucified, it was to wipe him off of future history, but he rose and remains. The temple never rose again after its destruction. It remains in ashes whereas Christ is alive today, tomorrow, and forever.
