What is a Minor Basilica?

The popes designate minor basilicas. These churches celebrate large liturgical occasions or diocesan gatherings. Once named a basilica, the church always remain a basilica. In San Francisco diocese, Mission Dolores was named a minor basilica in 1952.

The Nation and Church differ on migrants

The Church's mission is to reach out to those on the margins. This includes refugees, migrants, displaced persons. God abandons no one because of their circumstances. The Church in Christ's names is not allowed to ignore suffering or human traumas. The Catholic Church has historically been a pioneer in the U.S. in supporting immigrants; Europeans, Central Americans, South Americans, lately Haitians and Afghans. At the same time, the Church recognizes laws have to be respected and urges immigration reforms. In the meanwhile, many refugees flee to the U.S. for a better life and die in their efforts to reach this land of hope and prosperity.
