Matthew 5 : 17 - 37



Much of faith was codified into law by the scribes. It was hard to know whether one was living out of faith or the practice of the laws. Here Jesus deals with the 5th Commandment, “Thou shalt not kill.” He notes certain angry emotions which lead to violence and murder, such as adultery, slander, false oaths, injustices of serious nature, misleading people down the wrong paths, exploiting people, etc. can all lead to violent anger which leads to murder. He encourages people to be watchful, mindful of such dangerous instincts.

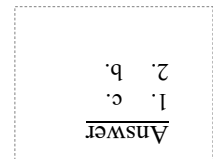
