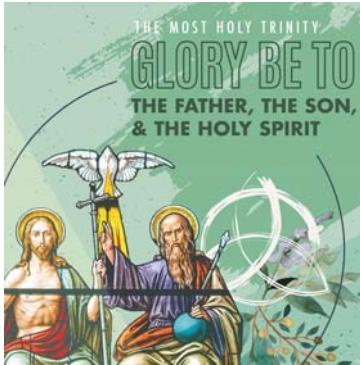


The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

John 3 : 16 – 18

Pope Francis

Marriage through a Catholic Sacrament is not a ceremony or a social event; or a day of a princess or prince. It is a bond with God’s fingerprint on it open to creation. This is a Sacrament filled with responsibilities that only mature people can receive.

Evangelization

Catechesis

Eucharistic Revival

1. The decline in Mass attendance
2. Only 31% of Catholics believe in the real presence
3. Catechesis is failing to explain these truths
4. Poor celebrations of the Mass

Pope Benedict XVI said, *“The best Catechesis on the Eucharist is to celebrate Mass well.”*

Not long ago, the family attended Mass together. Today, sports has broken up this beautiful union of families coming together at Mass. Let’s hope the Revival has success.

Polarization (Part 2 of 4)

Polarization is the constant awareness of threat, a lack of being safe expressing my own beliefs.
