Matthew 9 : 36 - 10 : 8



It seems Jesus made a ritual in the sending forth of the twelve apostles, almost like an ordination, except for the inclusion of the Eucharist not yet instituted. He called them by name. He preached to them, instructed them, prayed over them, and sent them out in His name. The ordination of Catholic priests follows this biblical ritual which Christ himself used at the first sending out.
