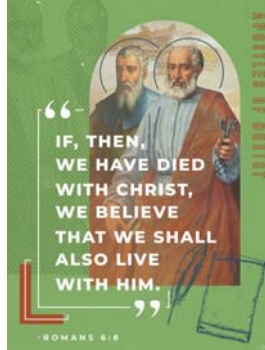


## Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 10 : 26 - 33



Alexander Whyte, a renowned 18th Century Puritan preacher and writer, said for one's thoughts and beliefs to be accepted by one's own flock is nothing to be contented about. But when the message attracts strangers, unbelievers, agnostics back to the fold, then that is God at work and leaves me stunned and silent.
