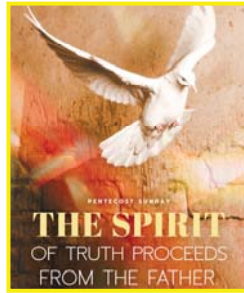


Pentecost Sunday

Vatican Facts

Avignon Palace 1309 –1376. Seven Popes lived in Avignon Fortress, South of France. Rome was a city in chaos and violence so the Pontiffs exiled themselves to France. The Popes built this Palace but much of its grandeur was destroyed during the French Revolution. Today its magnificence is being restored by the French government.

Church Council

Council of Vienne, 1311—1313, France. 300 Bishops attended as well as kings and patriarchs. It was held in Vienne where the Papacy had relocated to Avignon, France. Accusations against the Knights Templars. Pope Clement V decided to suppress the Templars. King Philip IV of France charged them with heresy, denying belief in Christ, spitting on the cross and other immoral behaviours. Philip gained by dismantling of this superior army and its wealth taken. Today its known all charges were false and fabricated.

Haiti

As some people ran out of Haiti as quickly as they can from the chaos and violence, the clergy remain to serve the people. One priest said, "Where are we to go. We must be with the people.
