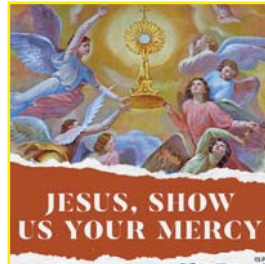


Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 6 : 1 - 6



The Catholic Church has always stood by that Joseph and Mary had only one child Jesus. Protestants do not agree with us fifteen centuries later. Tribal communities were close and intimate, so much so they saw each other as brothers and sisters. They were not as interested as we are in defining relationship distinctions as 1st cousins, 2nd cousins, in-laws, uncle, aunts, etc. The tribe defined us as we are all brothers and sisters as members of the tribe. Catholicism doesn't always see scripture to be taken literally.

Is Christian Charity the same as Tolerance?

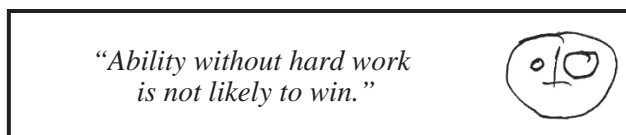
No. Tolerance today has become I don't approve what you are doing but I will not interfere, usually because of civility. Charity will make moral judgements, and with love and kindness, get involved to help you change the errors of your ways. Charity will not silently stand by and do nothing.

Should the Church refuse Communion to anyone?

It is certainly within the authority of the Bishops to canonically do so. When Catholic politicians publically oppose what is central to Catholic Faith, then to clarify moral error, sacramental discipline is the best way to do this, because it visibly rebukes heresy. Some go further and say to mislead people on Catholic doctrine, already that persons have excluded themselves from the Church as they are now acting as non-believers in Catholicism, so it is they who have left the Church. One cannot be a Catholic professing contrary theologies.
