Vatican Fact

The Vatican has a state-of-the-art telescope with a 1.8-meter diameter mirror – the Vatican Advanced Technology Telescope (VATT). It sits on top of Mount Graham in southeast Arizona and the Vatican conducts astronomical research out of here.

Catholic Ouestions

Many people no longer come to Mass, but they still receive communion when they come. Is this right? Not long ago, it was considered a mortal sin to miss Mass, therefore no one missed Mass. Today missing Mass is the norm with no valid reason for this practice. The Church teaches we receive Holy Communion only if we are in a state of grace; in another word, no mortal sins. The Eucharist is a means towards building our relationship with God, strengthening our Faith and supporting the Church and our Faith communities. All of this does matter. Respect for Eucharist matters.

Universal Church

The Church has always been in and out of crisis during its long history. No matter what the age is, to stay in the Church will depend in large measure on what one thinks the Church is. Many remain in the Church despites its glories and miseries because it is the building God has made his home on earth. The Church founded by Christ exists as a sign of the City of God and as such sacraments encountering his Divine presence.

Famous Churches

Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Mexico. Our Lady appeared to Juan Diego, a recent convert, asked him to tell the bishop to build a church in her honor. The event is truly amazing. Pick Castilian roses on Tepeyac hill (there are no roses here.) Place them in your tilma where the image of Mary is imprinted upon. The tilma is cactus fibers that cannot last. 450 years and yet still seen in the Basilica. A bomb in 1920 thrown at it did not destroy it. The tilma shows the stars on that night of her appearance and the reflection of Juan and the bishop in her eyes. Mexico was converted to Christianity by this garment, 10 years after the fall of the Aztec Empire. (A must visit).


