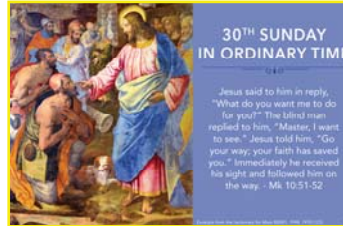


Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 10 : 46 - 52

Church Councils

Council of Trent, 1545-1563. One of the great Councils in Church history. It spanned the era's of five Popes. The Council was held in Trent in Italy. No protestants attended the Council. Twenty-five sessions in all. It addressed:

1. Scripture. Under hierarchical authority, not lay interpretations.
2. Theology. We cannot save ourselves except God works. Christ is our Savior.
3. Sacraments. Holy Communion at seven years of age. Confession once a year. Bishops to visit their parishes. Bishops to live in their diocese. Seminaries for all priests, seven year formation. A catechism produced that would stand 400 years. A universal liturgy—Latin Mass.

Church became stronger and united after Trent.

Middle East War (Part 2 of 4)

In times of war, who are the good guys and who are the bad. The Abraham Accord (Israel to normalize agreements with different Arab countries) is now in ashes. Hamas incursion into Israel is a response to occupation and repression that has lasted for decades. Since 1948, Gaza has been under occupation, kept enclosed like an open prison. 70% of Gazans are refugees living in poverty and dire conditions. Many driven out of their lands for the new State of Israel. No conditions for development or prosperity. Palestinians say "Enough is enough."

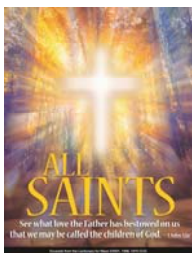
