

Order of Christian Initiation for

Adults (OCIA), formerly Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). USCCB approved the new translation of the process & curriculum in 2021, confirmed by the Holy See in 2024. "Order" is a collection of all the "rites", the journey to become Catholic. New categories: catechumens (unbaptized adults), unbaptized infants, baptized non-Catholic Christians, and baptized Catholics in need of confirmation. New terms: inquirer, catechumen, and elect—identify the stage each candidate is in the process. Starting 2025, Lent and Easter will reflect the new
