
The Bible tells us, even God rested on the seventh day to admire all of his creation.

She was involved in Church and national politics during Pope Gregory XI Pontificate. Her family tried to have her married but she gave her life for the Faith and lived an ascetic life. She was blessed with mystical visions. Saint Catherine was a humble soul. She was not interested in Church titles or honors. Her life strove for holiness.
