

Christmas Traditions

The candy cane - originated in Germany 1670. Its purpose was to keep children sit still during long Christmas services. The candy is shaped like a T to represent the crooks of the shepherd's staff that visited baby Jesus at Bethlehem. Red stripes represent the blood Jesus shed at Jerusalem. The peppermint flavor represents the hyssop drink offered to Jesus on the cross. J is the first letter of Jesus' name, and red and white are the colors of Christmas.


