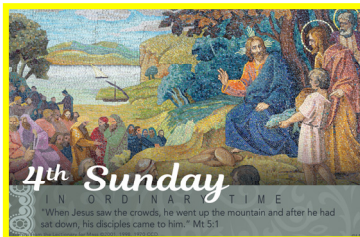


Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Pope Leo XIV on Catholic Education

1. Urges teachers to focus on spirituality as much as academic grades
2. Catholic teachers must be models of the faith entrusted to them in Catholic schools
3. Parents are the primary teachers. The school is there to support them
4. Catholic education is measured in its capacity to serve

Fr. Cathal Gallagher Pilgrim Story

Then he entered the *priesthood*. Next he became a *psychotherapist*, lastly ministered in *Peru*. He died in Peru 11/2023. Rest in peace, *Padre*, a *pacifist*.

David Henry Thoreau

David Thoreau (Naturalist) view of the Gospels, 1840. Some do not consider Thoreau a Christian. He did not call himself one either, but he revered the Gospels.

2. A substratum of good sense
