Pope Leo XIV (Part 1 of 2)

Pope Leo XIV attended high school, St. Augustine Boarding School for Boys, Michigan from 1969 to 1973. It was two hours from his home town Dolton, Illinois. He excelled in academics, graduated co-Valedictorian of his class. Football, tennis and bowling were his preferred sports. He was vice president of the student council, chief editor of the year book, president of library club and of his class. He was already being formed for leadership.

St. Vincent de Paul

In case we forget, St. Vincent de Paul works 365 days a year serves daily 1,200 people across San Francisco diocese, in food diners, housing, rent support, counseling, St. Vincent de Paul shops, and homeless shelters. It has been doing this for over 190 years. No fanfares, no public visibilities and no political favors or rewards for their work. More surprisingly it is a lay organization, present in over 150 countries, with 800,000 members and 1,500,000 volunteers globally. Founded in 1833 by Blessed Frederic Ozanam in Paris, France. Every diocese in the U.S. has a St. Vincent de Paul Society. What a work of grace!
